


# Alcohol & Other Drugs (AOD) Service Directory



#### 1. Intake

The AOD intake function is provided by ACSO for the Loddon catchment and provides local knowledge to support client pathways to all Victorian AOD services, inclusive of youth, adult, residential and non-residential, Aboriginal, state and commonwealth-funded AOD services. Intake services assist people to navigate the AOD service system and engage proactively with treatment providers on behalf of, and in partnership with, AOD clients and their families.		
ACSO can also provide a single 'family session' for family members/carers who have a loved one struggling with substance use disorders and/or addictions.		
DirectLine is a 24/7 statewide telephone and online service which supports people seeking AOD information, advice or referral, before, during and after treatment. Most clients identified as non-dependent users are offered telephone and online supports, including information and advice, brief interventions, worker-facilitated and self-guided supports, and referrals to non-AOD services. Clients identified as likely to require treatment for AOD related risk, harm or dependence are referred to catchment-based intake services (eg: ACSO for the Loddon Catchment). #### Important information about intake:

- Some AOD services can be accessed directly without going through the Intake process see details for specific services below.
- If you've had an AOD assessment in the last 12 months, you can restart services by contacting your previous treatment provider directly no new Intake required.
- For urgent situations, treatment providers may offer immediate face-to-face services or direct intake. Contact organisations directly to discuss these options.
- While providers will share information with the catchment-based intake provider, your immediate care is the priority.

#### 2. Assessment

Comprehensive assessments determine the level and type of treatment and support required by presenting clients.

Assessment ensures that a client's needs are adequately understood so that treatment plans best suit the needs of people who require support.

#### 3. Brief Intervention

Brief intervention is education and advice that aims to achieve a short-term reduction in harm associated with AOD use. This may include crisis intervention, harm reduction measures, relapse prevention planning, and support for co-occurring issues, such as mental health.

#### 4. Care, Recovery and Coordination (CRC)

The CRC service supports integrated treatment and care pathways for the highest need/risk clients who require a coordinated care response. CRC supports other AOD treatment services over a longer period through coordinating treatment planning, goal setting, and supported referral to other services.

#### 5. Intensive programs

The <u>Overdose Prevention</u>
<u>Program</u> works intensively to support individuals who are at the highest risk of overdose and are not already receiving care and recovery coordination services.

The Families at Risk Program supports families with children where the carer has alcohol and/or drug issues and are at risk of or currently have child protection involvement. Support aims to reduce the impact of alcohol and other drugs on families and children, reducing the number of families referred to Child Protection.

#### 6. General and Forensic Counselling

Counsellors provide evidencebased, therapeutic individual, group and family counselling interventions focusing on recovery-orientated care.

Different modes of counselling include face-to-face, online and telephone consultations for individuals and families, as well as group counselling.

#### 7. Pharmacotherapy

Pharmacotherapy or opioid replacement therapy (ORT) uses substitution medication to assist in the treatment of opioid addiction. Pharmacotherapy treatment improves clients' health, social and occupational functioning and reduces bloodborne virus transmission.

### 8. Needle Syringe Program (site based)

NSPs provide injecting drug users with sterile injecting equipment, sharps disposal containers, a range of sexual health products, as well as information, education, and support.

Naloxone is also available from most sites. Naloxone is a medication that will temporarily reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. Some pharmacies also provide naloxone.

#### 9. Outreach Programs

Mobile drug safety workers provide education on harm reduction and treatment pathways for drug users. The program proactively engages with vulnerable people experiencing harm from AOD who are not engaged with mainstream health, social support or AOD treatment services.

An <u>after-hours needle syringe</u> <u>delivery program</u> is available from Tuesday – Saturday 7.30pm – 10.45pm. Includes Naloxone. Naloxone is a medication that will temporarily reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. Call 1800 636 514.

Public Intoxication Response program provides an outreach-based response to individuals in need. This response includes conducting thorough health assessments, offering safe transportation to an appropriate location, monitoring the health and overall well-being of the individuals, and delivering follow-up care as needed.

#### 10. Home-based Withdrawal

Home-based withdrawal involves supported clinical withdrawal from a person's home. It includes assessment, withdrawal treatment and referral and information provision via face-to-face and telephone. The withdrawal nurse provides coordination with medical services such as GPs and assists clients to undertake a safe withdrawal while remaining within their own home.

#### 11. Residential Withdrawal

Residential withdrawal services support clients to safely withdraw from AOD dependence, in a supervised residential facility. Nova House is a 5-bed facility that supports low to medium risk (medically assessed) clients through the withdrawal process – typically 7 days in duration.

Some hospitals in the region also have options for residential withdrawal for certain substances.

There are other options for residential withdrawal in multiple locations in the state for those that are unsuitable for Nova house or local hospital-based withdrawal.

#### 12. Residential Rehabilitation

The Salvation Army Bendigo Bridge is an 18-bed, 12-week residential treatment program for those aged 18-35. The aims of the program are to establish an individual treatment plan, improve overall health and wellbeing, address underlying issues that have led to substance use, education, building self-efficacy to support ongoing support and to rebuild relationships.

Bendigo Health – The Dual Diagnosis Residential Unit is an eight-bed voluntary residential unit designed to treat individuals with co-occurring mental health and drug and or alcohol dependency.

There are other options for residential rehabilitation throughout the state. AOD clinicians will assess suitability based on client's needs.

#### 14. Peer Support

each participant.

Peer workers in the Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) sector use their lived experience as a powerful foundation for building authentic, trusting relationships with the people they support. Through shared understanding, they provide non-judgmental, personcentred support, offering harm reduction education and practical strategies to promote safer substance use or reduce related harms. Peer workers model selfdetermined change, as defined by the individual rather than the service, and collaborate within multidisciplinary teams to strengthen holistic treatment planning. Their role fosters connection, hope, and empowerment, reinforcing recovery-oriented, traumainformed, and rights-based approaches in AOD care.
