About The Position

Based within our Paediatric and Early Years service area the Doctors In Secondary Schools (DiSS) is an established, innovative and effective program operating in a number of our local schools. This General Practitioner role provides GP services at two local secondary schools, providing holistic GP care to students and families from those schools. In onsite purpose-built medical rooms, the GP and nurse provide a GP clinic one day per week at each school during school term.

Working collaboratively with our experienced registered nurse, school wellbeing and administration team this position requires strong organisational, clinical and communication skills and a genuine interest in adolescent health and wellbeing. Highly valued and utilised, this role has a workload reflective of the patients need, with most appointments booked for 30 minutes and administration time each day.

The role is supported further by a broader team of DiSS staff servicing other schools in the area, the Paediatric and Early Years Senior Leader and service area.
